ISPO Canada Symposium: Sept 30 – Oct 1, 2011

Call for Short Presentation / Case Study and Demonstrations

ISPO Canada will be adding two new session types to the 2011 Symposium program: **Short Presentation / Case Study** and **Demonstrations / Posters**. These new sessions will be in addition to the traditional multinational invited presentations and workshops.

To be considered for inclusion in the program, please submit the abstract form by email before **August 1, 2011**. The ISPO Canada Symposium committee will review all submissions and applicants will be contacted by email to confirm the review results.

The **Short Presentation / Case Study** session provides an opportunity for delegates to present novel and innovative contributions to the field of prosthetic and orthotic care. These 12-minute presentations could include case studies, technical methods, clinical approaches, ideas and theories, new technology, service innovations, etc..

Demonstrations / Posters will be part of a “Wine and Demonstrations” session, to be held on September 30. This session will allow delegates and exhibitors to provide demonstrations of their prosthetic and orthotic innovations in a “show and tell” or poster format. This could include patient specific solutions, unique design and fabrication methods, software, measurement methods, etc. Demonstrations should be 5-10 minutes long so that they can be repeated continuously during the 1 hour session. Delegates can visit each demonstration in a social setting (i.e., Wine and Cheese). Due to limited space, submissions will be accepted on a first-come-first serve basis and exhibitors and delegates are limited to one demonstration. Applicants are recommended to include an image/picture with their abstract that briefly describes the application/device and demonstration.
